	Basal condition:	Good, flared buttress rooting noted.	
	Trunk condition:	Reasonable condition noted, signs of removal of lower lateral branches resulting in an unusual form.

	Outer canopy condition:	Good needle cover throughout, with no notable deadwood, However, poor form noted from various stages of braches removal / reduction.	
<b>6.</b>	<b>Habitat</b>		
6.1	No habitats noted		
<b>7.</b>	<b>Evaluation</b>		
7.1	While T1 does have the potential to develop into a large, specimen tree, its current location (next to a residential property, with a highway and cables running parallel) prevents this from being a possibility. Even though T1 was noted to be a young specimen it has unfortunately already outgrown its location, and without continued pruning it is likely to cause light and overhanging problems.		
7.2	While the tree is visible from the conservation area, and its removal will be notable, it is not considered appropriate to enforce its retention with the knowledge of the fact it will continue to cause issues and further outgrow its location. The applications have		

	proposed to replant with a smaller fruiting tree which is more appropriate to the location. On balance, the proposed works are considered to be appropriate.

8.1	The notification is accepted in respect of the proposed works.		
<b>9.</b>	<b>Conditions</b>		
1.	The works hereby agreed to shall consist of the following: T1 Young Cedar. Fell. At 32 Main Street Lower Benefield.
