1.0 Background

1.1 In March 2007 a report was placed in front of this Committee detailing various issues raised as a result of the Licensing Act 2003. As part of this discussion members asked that they receive information relating to crime associated with licensed premises every six months.

2.0 Crime Statistics

2.1 The attached report in Appendix 1 is provided to East Northamptonshire Council on request and details the crime which is reported against each licensed premises. It does not include crime outside or near to these premises. The report details the name of the premises, type of offence and the number of crimes.

In addition, the police have provided the following crime volumes for East Northamptonshire.

3.0 Accident and Emergency Statistics

3.1 Northamptonshire NHS has provided statistics from Kettering and Northampton hospitals for the period October 2012 – December 2012, with a view to providing this information on a regular basis. A total of 427 assault victims attended Accident and Emergency at Kettering General Hospital and Northampton General Hospital during the period 1 October to 31 December 2012. Alcohol related assault data allows 321 of these assaults to be mapped at district level, of which four (1.2%) occurred in East Northamptonshire.

3.2 Half of the assaults occurred in “On the Street” locations. All of the assault victims in East Northamptonshire were male. Two of the four assaults occurred between 00:00 and 03:00 on Sunday mornings. Alcohol was involved in 75% of all cases. There were no repeat assault locations during the reporting period, but three of the four assaults took place in Rushden.

East Northamptonshire A&E Assault Q3 2012-13 Analysis

East Northamptonshire Summary of Quarter 3, 2012-2013 (October - December 2012)

A total of **427** assault victims attended Accident and Emergency at Kettering General Hospital and Northampton General Hospital during the period 1st October to 31st December 2012. Alcohol related assault data allows **321** of these assaults to be mapped at district level, of which **4 (1.2%)** occurred in East Northamptonshire.

The following table summarises the location breakdown of these cases.
