### Business and Planning Act 2020

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#### **Purpose of report**

To seek delegation for the adoption of the Business and Planning Act 2020, approve fees and recommend appropriate delegations

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#### **1.0 Background**

1.1 At the time of writing, the Business and Planning Bill is making its way through Parliament, but not yet enacted; however, it is expected to receive royal assent soon after the 20<sup>th</sup> July 2020. The Act would make district councils responsible for issuing pavement licences, which was previously carried out by county councils.

#### **2.0 Business and Planning Act 2020**

2.1 The Business and Planning Act 2020 (subject to enactment) is expected to introduce a new pavement licence regime designed to make it easier for premises in England serving food and drink such as bars, restaurants and pubs to seat and serve customers outdoors through temporary changes to planning procedures and alcohol licensing.

2.2 A pavement license permits furniture to be placed temporarily on the highway; this includes stalls, tables, chairs and articles such as umbrellas, barriers and heaters. Alcohol licensing changes will allow operators with existing on-sales to also serve alcohol for consumption off the premises and to make deliveries.

2.3 Applications are expected to be subject to seven days of consultation, with a decision then having to be taken within a further seven days. If a determination is not made within seven days of the end of the consultation period the license is deemed granted. The local authority may grant or reject the application after taking account of any representations.

2.4 The Act would allow the publication of conditions and the addition of conditions to individual premises licences. If a condition of the license is breached, the local authority may revoke the license or may require steps to be taken to remedy the breach. Where a license is granted, planning permission is deemed to have been given.

2.5 The legislation has a sunset clause so is expected to last only until 30 September 2021 unless extended by secondary legislation.

### **3.0 Delegation of powers**

- 3.1 It is recommended that Part 3.2 of the Council constitution (Scheme of Delegation) is amended to include the Business and Planning Act 2020 ('the Act').
- 3.2 It is recommended that authority to act under the Act is delegated to the Head of Environmental Services, Health Protection Manager, Licensing Enforcement Officer, Licensing Compliance Officer, Health Protection Technical Officer, Senior Environmental Health Officer, Environmental Health Officer and Trainee Environmental Health Officer.

### **4.0 Fees**

- 4.1 The Act is expected to allow a fee to be set by the local authority subject to a cap of £100. The local authority can decide how long the license should last for or leave it open ended, in which case it will expire at the end of September 2021. The activity of administration has been costed and determined to be £99 (without any enforcement activity). It is therefore recommended that the fee is set at £100 with no limit on the duration so all licenses will expire at the end of September 2021.

### **5.0 Equality and Diversity Implications**

- 5.1 An initial Equality Impact Assessment has been carried out and all equality and diversity implications are neutral. Neither a positive nor a negative impact has been identified. The initial Equality Impact Assessment can be seen in Appendix 1.

### **6.0 Privacy Impact Implications**

- 6.1 There are no privacy implications arising from this report.

### **7.0 Health Impact Assessments**

- 7.1 A Health Impact Assessment has been carried out which has identified positive and negative impacts arising from the introduction of pavement licensing. Work is ongoing with businesses with the aim of reducing some of the negative impacts and there are also mechanisms within the regime such as the application of conditions and the ability to revoke or require remedies where conditions are breached. The Health Impact Assessment can be seen in Appendix 2.

### **8.0 Legal Implications**

- 8.1 The recommendations in this report will ensure that the Council is fulfilling its legal obligations in respect of all of the measures expected to be in the Business and Planning Act 2020.

### **9.0 Risk Management**

- 9.1 The Council is at risk of non-compliance with legislation if it does not fulfil its statutory duty in respect of the Business and Planning Act 2020. Failure to administer and enforce pavement licensing may result in harm to individuals and in public nuisance, which would be likely to have a reputational impact on the council.

## **10.0 Resource and Financial Implications**

- 10.1 Pavement licensing will be carried out by the Central Licensing Administration Unit for all councils in the partnership. The function will be delivered within existing resource levels and budgets. It is expected that demand will be low for ENC; however, there may be significant demand in respect of our partners. The impact will be monitored to ensure the function is properly resourced from Health Protection within Environmental Services should demand exceed capacity. If this is the case it is envisaged that it will only be for a short period.
- 10.2 The aim is to be as consistent as we can in relation to the fee setting across the partnership. BC of Wellingborough has indicated that it intends to levy a fee of £100 and there has been no indication from Kettering BC or Corby BC at the time of writing.

## **11.0 Constitutional Implications**

- 11.1 There will need to be appropriate constitutional changes – see paragraph 3.

## **12.0 Implications for our Customers**

- 12.1 The introduction of pavement licensing will have a positive impact for residents by helping to expand the availability of socially distanced hospitality venues.

## **13.0 Corporate Outcomes**

- 13.1 The Corporate Outcomes are:
- Good Quality of Life – Prosperous, by helping with economic recovery and providing covid secure workplaces and premises.
  - Effective Management – by ensuring the licensing regime meets legislative requirements.

## **14.0 Recommendation**

- 14.1 The Council is recommended to delegate authority to the Head of Environmental Services to:-

- (1)** Adopt measures as required in relation to the pavement licensing regime contained in the Business and Planning Act 2020 (*subject to its future enactment*)

*(To allow implementation of the pavement licensing regime)*

Subject to **(1)** above

- (2)** Approve the recommended fee of £100 at paragraph 4.1

*(To ensure cost recovery for administration)*



- (3)** Amend Part 3.2 of the Constitution to delegate authority to:-
