Seminar on SHLAA/Housing Land Supply Issues

Recent planning appeal decisions at Raunds and Woodford have focussed on the issue of housing land supply in the District. Government guidance issued at the time of the revocation of the East Midlands Regional Plan (6 July) continues to emphasise a five year supply of deliverable housing land (PPS3, paragraph 54).
