### 1.0 Background

- 1.1 The community portals were introduced in 2003. They aimed to empower local communities to engage in local issues by creating an online community and allow business to advertise to those communities. The aim was in time to create a revenue stream for the portal.
- 1.2 Rutland Online (ROL) solutions are responsible for the development and support of the portal and forum software. This provides the facility for groups and individuals to create their own websites which are hosted on the portal.
- 1.3 Since the introduction of East Northants Online, technology has progressed considerably and the supplier is no longer investing in the current portal. The support for the portal ceases on the 31 March 2012
- 1.4 The portal costs the council £10,000 a year plus significant staffing resources to administer and maintain. This administration includes moderation of the on-line forums to ensure that the content is appropriate for a council sponsored portal. With very limited support to improve or develop the portal both from ROL and from diminished internal resources, further options are required for the future.

### 2.0 Main uses of Portal

2.1 Community portals are used to provide information to the local community. The information can be broken up into the following sections

Business directory – Listing of local businesses

Group listings - Details of local groups

Parish council Information - Minutes, agendas

Other local websites

Local events and tourism Information

- 2.1 An audit conducted in April 2011 found a large proportion of the information was no longer being updated and the majority of groups now had their own websites or utilised other online technologies such as social media.
- 2.2 There are eight parish councils that are using the facility. The remaining parish councils have sourced an alternative provider or do not have a website.

#### 3.0 Alternatives to the portals

- 3.1 Technology has progressed significantly since the portals were introduced back in 2003. As a result the internet has become more accessible and used by a wider audience.
- 3.2 The introduction of social media, such as Facebook and Twitter has become more prevalent over the years and has developed into a means of communicating with groups and individuals. The current forum groups could take advantage of these tools and, if wanted, gain a wider audience. These tools are all free to use.
- 3.3 There are further alternatives that could be used by local groups:
  The council's Local View site which could provide information on the location of groups and clubs and regular activities.
  Northants online For business listings
  Find it For clubs and businesses
- 3.4 There are various free website packages available from sites as such Google, Yahoo and Weebly which could be used by parish councils to create their own websites. These would allow parish councils to have more control over the look and feel of the website and the amount of information they wish to publish.
- 3.5 There are also companies who specialise in the development of parish websites and some of which are already used in the district.
- 3.6 Use of these alternatives would enable communities to continue to develop and maintain their websites and promote the issues that are important to them.

#### 4.0 Considerations

- 4.1 To enable users to migrate their data to a new site they will need access to the current data. This is currently held by the supplier and there may a cost associated with its release.
- 4.2 There are a number of Forum users who are quite active on the current site. Appropriate notice and help will need to be given to these users to find an alternative solution.
- 4.3 There are number of parish council sites that have a large amount of content on their websites. The time and effort to migrate this information will need to considered, along with the amount of resource available at each parish. Parishes will also need to make a decision on the amount of data they want to migrate.
- 4.4 There is now fewer staff within ICT with the time or ability to maintain the portal.

### 5.0 Equalities and impact assessment

5.1 There are no equality or diversity implications arising from this report.

# 6.0 Legal Implications

6.1 There are no legal implications associated with the recommendation below.

#### 7.0 Risks

- 7.1 Data Transfer There will need to be engagement from the software supplier and the data will need to be supplied in a usable manner. The risk is the timescale taken to receive this data and potential cost.
- 7.2 Council's Reputation The removal of the portal may create a negative impression of East Northamptonshire council. To mitigate this risk users will have at least 9 months to move their data and will be offered alternative outlets where possible.
- 7.3 Staffing Resources There will be significant resources from the Applications Support Team to manage the project and any transition requirements, which may impact other projects.

#### 8.0 Financial Implications

8.1 The use of alternative systems will save East Northamptonshire Council £10,000 per year in revenue.

#### 9.0 Corporate Outcomes

9.1 The corporate outcomes this proposal will help deliver are:Good Value for MoneyStrong Community Leadership

#### 10.0 Options Considered

- 10.1 The portal is turned off on the 31 March 2012 and the data is given to the relevant parties for their use. Limited support for assisting with the transition may be available, but is not guaranteed.
- 10.2 To seek a replacement for the current portal. This option was not investigated further as a viable alternative exist for all current users.

#### 11.0 Summary

11.1 Viable alternatives are available for all current users which would not have a future draw on council resources

#### 12.0 Recommendation

12.1 Members are recommended approve the supported transfer of community forums, community groups and parish council from East Northants Online to alternative, non-council, sites with a saving of £10,000 from 2012/13.
